**Our Congregation Council at its September 13 Meeting ...**

- Reviewed letters of thanks from National Multiple Sclerosis Society and Lutheran Social Ministries.
- Heard the cleaning service that has been servicing the Day Care is now cleaning the Church three times per week and that the results have been very good.
- Heard that we are moving forward with hiring a new maintenance person.
- Parents will be asked to set up and break down Sunday school classrooms until new maintenance person is hired.
- Options are being investigated to replace or repair the duplicator.
- Heard that we are working to update and refine our list of email addresses so that we can improve communications and look for ways to reduce our printing costs.
- Received draft of Human Resources Handbook to review.
- Heard a projected Spending plan for 2012.
- Commitment Sunday campaign will last four weeks and conclude with a potluck supper.
- Heard that we met our goal of raising \$35,000 for the Capital fund plan in order to qualify for matching funds
- Heard that we still need \$38,301 to meet our year one goal of \$150,000 for the Capital Campaign.
- Decided to form a Campaign Committee to keep information about the Capital Campaign flowing to our congregation.
- Heard an update on the status of the Capital Campaign's first year projects:
  - a. Heard that drainage for sanctuary is now included in the parking lot paving project due to significant flooding in the sanctuary.
  - b. Heard a recommendation that the Boiler project be addressed as a first priority given the time of year.
  - c. Heard a recommendation that the Paving and Drainage project be addressed in two phases with the drainage being addressed first. This was related to both the time of year and funds available.
- Heard an update on the status of NCD Committee which is developing an action plan to address the issues identified from the focus groups.
- Heard that the Social Outreach Task Force is also developing an action plan.
- Heard that Myla Groth has accepted an invitation to serve as Chair of the Shalom Committee.
- Heard that the Service of Remembrance was successful and prayer vigil was well planned and worked well.
- Janis Mays-Holder will be guest preacher on September 25, 2011.
- Heard that the congregation has donated many replacement supplies for SHIP.

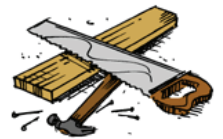

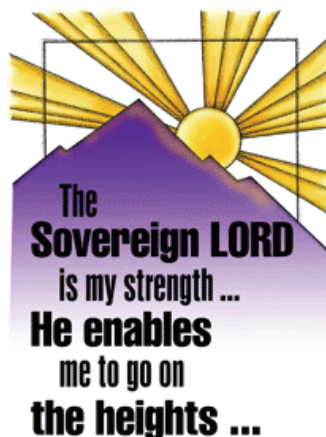
