Update on Capital Improvement Projects

Our capital fund raising campaign, "Lifting Us Up, Caring For God's House", has received \$118,795 towards our goal of \$150,000 by June of 2012.

The Luther Hall boiler replacement is currently being scheduled and the engineering design work for our drainage/paving project is underway. We expect to spend approximately \$50,000 for these two items and will need an additional \$100,000 to complete the drainage and paving next Spring/Summer.

Annual Congregation Financial Meeting

Our Congregation Council at its November 8 Meeting ...



- Reviewed letters of thanks from Bishop Riley for the time council spent meeting with him earlier this year and the ELCIN General Secretary for our donation to the Namibia congregation.
- Heard that Christ Lutheran Church in Union has kindly donated \$15,000 to our congregation. The church was sold and the congregation is donating proceeds to congregations that have ties with Christ Lutheran as well as seminaries and synod. The Good Shepherd ties are through Jaime Roos Dungey and Judy McCarthy. The one stipulation is that the monies not be used to fund general operations.
- Heard that the congregation will celebrate Charles German's 40th anniversary on Sunday, November 13, 2011.
- Adopted the Personnel Policy Handbook with terms effective January 1, 2012.
- Approved the purchase of a digital duplicator for the church office at a cost of \$3,700.
- Approved that a task force, including members representing the finance, property and executive teams, design guidelines for whenever 3 bids are required before purchasing equipment and/or services for the church. Guidelines will be presented to council for approval.
- Reviewed a projected Spending plan for 2012 – with work to continue on January 8, 2012.
- Commitment Sunday campaign lasted four weeks and concludes with commitment Sunday on November 13.
- Heard an update on the status of the Capital Campaign's first year projects.
- Heard that the Living Nativity will be held on December 17, 2011 at 5:00 and 7:00.

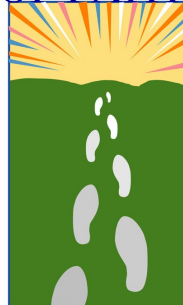

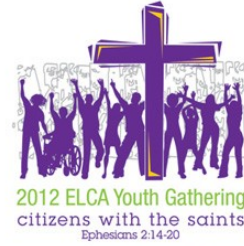

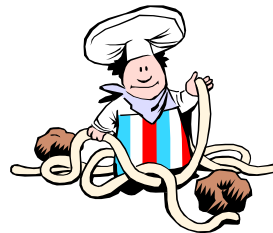
