Update on Capital Improvement Projects

Our capital fund-raising campaign, "Lifting Us Up, Caring for God's House," has received \$121,200 to date. Our short term goal is to collect \$150,000 by June 2012 to pay for the boiler replacement and the drainage/paving project. An additional \$150,000 is needed by 2013 for the remaining projects, including the replacement of the siding on the church.

The replacement of the boiler which heats Luther Hall and the daycare will cost approximately \$20,000 thanks to the generosity of Dorsey Finn. Dorsey is donating his time and labor to install the boiler for us. The work is scheduled for Dec 9-11.

Engineering design work is underway for the drainage/paving project.

Your contributions are helping to make Good Shepherd a safer, warmer, and more inviting place for our staff, congregation, the daycare, and our guests. Contributions are still needed to fund these projects.

THRIVENT OPPORTUNITIES

Have You Voted your Thrivent Choice \$\$\$\$ Yet?

Thrivent benefit members have until March 31, 2012 to vote and allocate their assigned 2011 Thrivent Choice dollars. After that, all unallocated dollars return to the national pool for 2012. 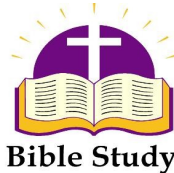

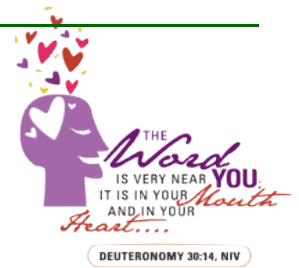

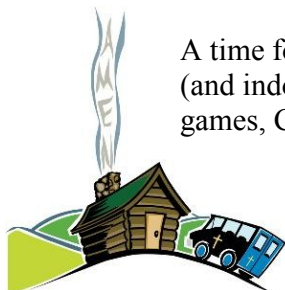
